




- Presentations focus on real-world experience with geospatial science and technologies in the workplace

- 2011 (May): 1st ASPRS Student-run competition: GeoLeague Challenge (UF team won 1st)
- 2011 (Aug): 1st ISPRS Student Consortium Summer School in North America (Fayetteville, NC)
- 2013: SAC expanded to eight 2-year term positions
- 2014 (Jul/Aug): 1st Student Summer Education Assembly (TBD)


MISSION : Provide a bridge between the National SAC and Florida Region students to increase Brief History: regional ASPRS student activities
